

Our change makers, <u>Leticia Kossuth and Kim Tito</u>, volunteered to help with Veterans Stand Down on October 28 from 10-4pm. They rallied the members to collect and sort the items. Funds were budgeted for this event and we raised the money through our Festival of Trees held in December. All members participated with the fundraising. Our local Stand Down was a one-day event during which VA staff asks other organizations to donate food, clothing and health screenings to homeless and at-risk Veterans. In addition, Veterans also receive referrals for health care, housing solutions, employment, substance use treatment, mental health counseling and other essential services. These ladies gave out much needed items to the vets that visited their booth. VA had over 600 homeless veterans attend the event and over 800 volunteers. Thank you, Leticia and Kim for volunteering your time to this wonderful event.

- 1. At our October Business Meeting, members donated socks to the Altrusa of Southern California Virtual Club. Their "Socktober" drive is to benefit homeless and foster students in National City and Chula Vista, grades TK 6th. 304 pairs of socks were collected!!!
- 2. San Diego is a military town and a non-profit called "Operation Dress Code" held a clothing drive to benefit our female veterans who will soon be joining the civilian work force. Gently used professional clothing was also collected at our October Business Meeting. The generosity of our members filled Pat Zoller's car! A sorting day found Pat, Sandy, and Sylvia doing behind the scenes work. Then Kathy and Diana worked the event on Sunday, November 5th. It was such a rewarding experience to help these women choose entire outfits free of charge. The emotions were felt on both sides.
- 3. On Saturday, November 18th, 16 club and family members volunteered at the Jacob & Cushman's San Diego Food Bank. 2,870 pounds of food were packed into 240 boxes. Additionally, several pallets of apples were bagged. All these items will be distributed throughout San Diego County during the week of Thanksgiving.
