"Training the Ponies" ~ ASTRA Clubs

We have various ASTRA clubs in District Eleven and the majority are thriving. ASTRA is a wonderful addition to your Altrusa club. ASTRA members can help your

club with fundraising, social events and much more since they are younger and creative. Guess what? ASTRA members can become future Altrusa members. Everything you need to know about ASTRA is on the astra.altrusa.org website. I have listed below the information you need to know now.

- 1. ASTRA Graduation Cord Request: Congratulations to your graduates. Allow them to represent their participation in ASTRA with cords to wear over their gowns as they walk across the stage at graduation. Cords are provided free of charge. Please request at least 2 weeks prior to date of graduation. Please complete and submit form to Altrusa@Altrusa.org.
- 2. Altrusa International Foundation Scholarships: the opportunity to recognize high school senior ASTRA members and ASTRA members who are currently attending college who have grown through service in ASTRA. A winning applicant will have demonstrated exemplary Altruism within his or her community. Applicants must have applied to an institution of higher learning (college, university, tech school, etc.) which they will be attending within seven months of the March 15 deadline for application. The application is designed to help the applying ASTRA member exhibit their growth in Ability, Service, Training, Responsibility and Achievement through service to their community and sponsoring Altrusa Club. Up to four scholarships will be awarded annually for high school students and four scholarships for college students in the following amounts: Two \$2,000 each Two \$1,000 each.
- 3. ASTRA SERVICE AWARD: The ASTRA Club Service Award has been established by Altrusa International and sponsored by Altrusa International Foundation to encourage ASTRA Clubs to actively participate in service projects designed to meet specific needs in the local community or within their own school community. This award is an opportunity for Altrusa International to recognize outstanding ASTRA Clubs for their achievements in service. Award submissions are due to Melinda Aguirre, ASTRA District Chair, by March 1; email melinda.aguirre84@yahoo.com.
- 4. 2023 ASTRA Club Annual Report: Completing this survey should only take about 3- 4 minutes. To move between pages, use the "Prev" and "Next" buttons at the bottom of the survey. Please collect any information needed prior to starting the survey. You will know the answer to most questions but need to report how many service projects the club worked on and how many community service hours ASTRA members had for the year (approximately). Please submit this online by June 1st.

Self-Awareness is beneficial to the future of ASTRA Students. When students join ASTRA, they have opportunities to learn more about themselves, their goals, and their strengths. They will find out what they are good at. This is where the sponsoring club comes in to play. Altrusa Clubs become mentors to the ASTRA members. Together they can decide projects they want to volunteer for in the community. Some of the Altrusa Clubs in District Eleven offer scholarships to the graduating ASTRA members.

DISTRICT ELEVEN RECENT BOARD BUSINESS

At the District board meeting in January an important issue was discussed and a motion was approved about restructuring the number of board members needed to conduct district business. Here is a review of a policy change that will go into effect for the next biennium.

DISTRICT ELEVEN BOARD OF OFFICERS RESTRUCTURE

Recently the Director of the District Eleven Board resigned from her position. We were sorry to lose her, but we understood and respected her decision. This resignation brought up some questions and concerns about the structure of District Eleven's Board of Officers. Sometimes when things happen it opens opportunities to think about making changes. Before the board decided how to handle the resignation of a board member, we did research on how to proceed and also it gave us the opportunity to find out more about the composition of other district boards in Altrusa.

It was interesting to find out that not all District Boards are formatted the same way. Of course, there are certain officers that are required but there is also flexibility to establish the best combination of officers for each unique district. Some districts have as many as ten board members and some have as few as seven. Until this biennium we had conducted district business with nine board members.

Our Altrusa organization has experienced a lot of changes since the Covid Pandemic. We have been challenged to accept new ways of doing things. One of our current challenges is increased costs and we have had to be more conscious of how we spend district money without having to increase dues. This biennium's District Board and leadership team has embraced these challenges and are open to exploring new options.

After a lot of discussion and consideration the District Board has decided they will NOT fill the vacant Director position on the 2023-2025 Board. They have also approved changes to District Eleven Policies to restructure the composition of the District Eleven Board. Additional changes will also include the elimination of the appointed position of Parliamentarian. The duties of the Parliamentarian will be assumed by the Immediate Past Governor. Also, to make the transition easier for the newly elected Treasurer, the outgoing Treasurer will serve an additional one-year term on the board in an advisory role as a non-voting member to train and assist the Treasurer with duties and responsibilities. This new policy will go into effect for the 2025-2027 biennium.

Here is the new policy with changes in italics that has been approved by the District Board:

ARTICLE 4 - DISTRICT ELEVEN BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A. District Board

- 1. District Board is composed of: Governor; Governor-Elect; *Vice Governor*; one Director; Treasurer; Immediate Past Governor, serving as Leadership Trainer *and Parliamentarian with a vote as Immediate Past Governor*; and *non-voting members, Outgoing Treasurer, and* the appointed *position of* Secretary.
- 2. The outgoing District Treasurer will remain on the District Board for an additional year after their elected term, in a non-voting position, to train the newly elected District Treasurer and assist in the transition. Board meetings will be attended only as needed.
